Although we are disappointed that the first surgical trip isn't going to happen in April because of the virus, Jason is thankful to have more time to prepare. He has been going over to the center several days a week to continue cleaning, organizing, and setting up equipment. We are still praying to have the first surgical team in August of this year. Will you pray God will open doors for this to happen?

We do have a huge praise. We were going to have to purchase a very large generator to power the surgical center before we could preform surgeries. A few people associated with Medical Missions Outreach heard about this financial need and have provided all of the funds necessary to buy the generator. We were in the process of getting it installed before the virus outbreak. Once this curfew and pandemic is over, we will be able to purchase and install the generator.
