This past week in Honduras has been "Semana Santa" or "holy week." It is one of the most popular holidays here leading up to Easter. Many people travel out of town to the beach and most have time off work for Thursday and Friday. Our church will celebrate Easter on Sunday at an earlier time. Everyone is going to bring sweet bread. The most popular kind will be "semitas." This bread is a semisweet, dense bread capped with a crisp mixture of oil and sugar and is best served with a warm cup of coffee.



The weather here has been sunny and hot! April tends to be the hottest month during the year and a few weeks ago we had some 100 degree days. The kids are very thankful for our swimming pool during those hot days. Sarah and the kids are finishing up the school year. Summer will be a more relaxed pace, but still try to keep to a routine. We unfortunately had to cancel our surgical team for April. This has prompted us to move forward with a different type of recruitment method. Our family has decided to travel back to W.V. in July in order to meet with churches, doctors, and other healthcare providers to share about the upcoming surgical trips for 2023. We are also going to be raising extra monthly support to help with the costs of the ministry. Right now our support is a solid 92%. We would like to have an additional \$1000 monthly support. This would go into a work fund through our agency. The Lord has been faithful to provide for all of our family's needs. Thank you to those who you who faithfully give each month!

In the next few weeks, we will be releasing the 2023 surgical calendar. We are also exploring the possibility of having doctors create their own teams and picking a week during the year to come down. The autoclave (the large sterilization machine) has safely arrived in Honduras and is currently being installed. Thank you to those who gave toward that project! We were able to purchase the reverse osmosis filter because the water here is very hard and would damage the machine. There were some issues with the water pump and electrical work, but thankfully we have those resolved. We are thankful to have several men in our church who can do this type of work.

In addition we had a donation to purchase new (to us) anesthesia machines. Jason is working on getting those shipped to Honduras in the next two months. We are excited to be hiring a part-time office manager. A young lady from our church will take on this position and start next week.
